


September 2025 Newsletter

Safeguarding Information





In the interests of health and safety we now ask that children do not bring any <u>shellfish products</u> or <u>nut products</u> to school for either break or lunch. <u>This includes Nutella.</u>



We would like to take the opportunity to remind parents/guardians that no cars are permitted inside the school grounds at any time unless this has been pre-arranged with Mrs McCafferty or you are a blue badge holder- spaces are very limited. Please share this information with grandparents and childminders as refusal often causes offence.

Please ensure that the school gates are kept clear. Cars should not be parked on the yellow zigzag lines outside the school gates at any time. Please talk to your child about general road safety. Enter and exit the school using the pedestrian gates only. Once your child is collected from school, please keep them beside you at all times. We are delighted to share that our Primary 1, Primary 2 and Primary 3 classes will participate in the Musical Pathways to Learning Programme (MPL) every Friday. These music lessons are facilitated by a musical specialist: Mrs H. O'Hare.

The Musical Pathways to Learning Programme focuses on the main elements of music (beat, pulse, and rhythm) but it also focuses on creativity and expression. Therefore, the children involved in the project have access to consistent, high quality music provision which will provide an excellent foundation to instrumental learning or further studies in music. It also provides an opportunity for the children to explore communication skills and of course have fun!

The MPL programme has been shown to:

- -help children find their singing voice.
- -develop intellect and character
- -develop imagination
- -build self-esteem
- -help children acquire self-discipline, awareness and tolerance
- -develop social and communication skills



Brothers and Sisters after school provision (2-3pm) for Primary 1 & 2 children.

In order to support our school community, we will be offering afterschool supervision for children in Primary 2 (from Monday 1st September) and Primary 1 (from Monday 29th September) who has an older sibling in Primary 3-7 currently at the school. This will allow for 1 family pick up. Children staying should pack a healthy snack for this time. Please let your child's class teacher know if you want to avail of this service. - Breakfast club will commence on Monday 1st September for Primary 1-7 children, and then on Monday 22nd September for Nursery children also.
- Breakfast club is open from 8.10am-8.30am. Children cannot attend breakfast club after 8.30am.
- Please only send your child if they are independent when eating to ensure their wellbeing.
- Children should be accompanied by an adult to the canteen door.
- Please enter the **school grounds via the upper nursery gate** and directly into the canteen via the steps located beside the school reception area.
- The cost of this will be £1 per day, per child. This should be paid in cash each day to breakfast club supervisory staff. This charge covers the cost of food, cleaning supplies and staff.
- Children will have a choice of toast, cereals, fruit juice and milk each day.
